California Pharmacy Technician Training Programs

If you are interested in a career as a pharmacy technician, you can begin by enrolling in a pharmacy technician or a pharmacy technology training program. In addition, licensure is required in the state of California. According to the California State Board of Pharmacy:

To be licensed as a pharmacy technician in California, you must qualify under A, B, or C as listed below and be a high school graduate or possess a general educational development (GED) certificate:

A. If you are qualifying by one of the following methods, the ACPTEdit of Completed Coursework or Graduation for Pharmacy Technician (page 4 of the application) must be submitted with your application.

An Associate Degree in Pharmacy Technology:

Any other course that provides a minimum of 340 hours of instruction as specified in Title 16 California Code of Regulation section 1793.8(c):

A training course accredited by the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists (ASHP), or

Graduation from a school of pharmacy accredited by the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE).

B. If you are certified by the Pharmacy Technician Certification Board (PTCB), you must submit a certified true copy of your PTCB certificate or the original certificate with your application. (A certified true copy is a copy that has been certified or notarized as a true copy.)

C. If you are qualifying by training provided by a branch of the federal armed services, you must submit a copy of your DD-14 with your application.

Fortunately, hundreds of California schools offer excellent training programs that can help you satisfy the state's requirements. The following lists represent only a fraction of what California has to offer.
